Daly Elementary- 5th Grade Curriculum Guide for Library

Fayette R-III Mission: To educate all students to be ethical, successful citizens.

The 5th Grade Learning Goals are based on the Missouri Learning Standards. For Library Media purposes, these standards include the American Association of School Librarians (AASL) Standards for the 21st-Century Learner and the Missouri Information and Communications Technology Literacy GLEs which define the knowledge and skills students need to succeed in college, other postsecondary training and careers. This document is designed to make clear what each child should know and be able to do by the end of 5th Grade.

Course Description: The fifth-grade curriculum is based on four strands: Find Information (Think); Use Information (Create); Share Information (Participate) and Enjoy (Grow). Instruction is organized into four units: Library Resources, Research Skills, Technology Literacy, and Literature Appreciation. These units are integrated with content-area instruction. In fifth grade, students build on their previous knowledge and experience in order to become critical thinkers and users of information. They are introduced to additional strategies to avoid cyber-bullying. They continue to use technology to locate, organize and share information and ideas.

Course Rationale: The library media center is a place where students learn and use a variety of resources. The Library Media Specialist (LMS) will shape the student's concept of how to find information by teaching them to inquire, think critically, and gain knowledge. The LMS, along with the students, will utilize information to draw conclusions, make informed decisions, apply knowledge to new situations, and create new knowledge. Students will share knowledge and participate ethically and productively as members of society. In addition, students will pursue personal and aesthetic growth through experiencing a variety of genres and award-winning literature.
